

Indoor field space is multi-use and can accommodate a variety of structured and spontaneous uses. This space would allow for year-round training opportunities for the thousands of registered soccer players in Kamloops and host international competitions, training camps, and events that would expand the Tournament Capital program's economic spinoff. This facility can also support dry-floor training for other sports.



As Kamloops grows and there continues to be demand for both structured and spontaneous dry-floor space, it is probable that the City will need to expand the provision of gymnasium and fieldhouse space.

Current Supply:

- full-sized gymnasium/fieldhouse at the Tournament Capital Centre
- school gymnasiums across the city (with varying levels of community access and use)
- indoor dome facility with artificial turf managed by the Kamloops Youth Soccer Association
- private facility available through Soccer Quest
- no City-owned indoor turf facilities

Current Need:

 In 2018, there were nearly 15,000 hours booked on outdoor fields, and we continue to experience moderate levels of growth.
